3. a future arranged action
E.g. I (meet) John on Monday
I am meeting John on Monday (present continuous)
4. a frequently occurring action which annoys the speaker
E.g. She (always, leave) the front door open.
She is always leaving the front door open (present continuous)
5. a temporary action

10. two actions in the past occurring simultaneously
E.g. I (clean) the windscreen while they (put) the luggage in the boot.
I was cleaning the windscreen while they were putting the luggage in the boot. boot: the space at the back of a car that you put bags, cases, etc. in bonnet: the metal part over the front of a vehicle, usually covering the engine. (past continuous)
11. an intention in the past
E.g. I (buy) a car but I didn't have enough money
I was going to buy a car but I didn't have enough money (past continuous)
12. a request without being direct
E.g. I (wonder) if I could have a lift home
I was wondering if I could borrow some money (past continuous)
13. a continuous past action completed before another past action
E.g. He (drive) all day, so he was very tired when he arrived
He had been driving all day, so he was very tired when he arrived (past perfect continuous)

race: move fast.

14. an action which in progress at a certain time in the future
E.g. This time next week, we (listen) to the BBC
This time next week, we will be listening to the BBC (future continuous)
15. an action which began before a certain future time and is not over
E.g. By next month I (teach) English for 25 years
By next month I will have been teaching English for 25 years (future perfect continuous)
