- Judges need to be impartial to make objective decisions. a) pseudoscientific: falsely or mistakenly claimed or regarded as being based on scientific method b) fabricated: something false which is invented or produced in order to deceive someone c) biased: preferring one person, thing, or idea to another in a way that is unfair d) impartial: not connected to or influenced by one particular person or group e) sensationalist: presenting events in a way that makes them seem as exciting or shocking as possible.
